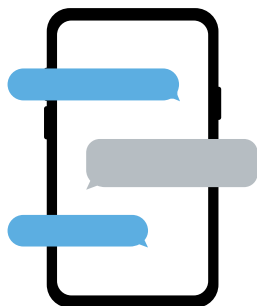

SAFETY NOTICE



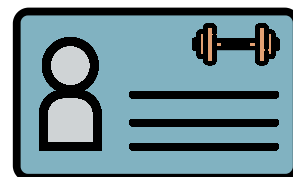

WHATS UP IN THE NIGHT SKY



SuperMoon

When and where to look for the next Supermoons:
Here are the dates and rising times for upcoming supermoons.
The Moon rises in the east.

- 5th December, 7:57pm (AWST)
- 3rd January 2026, 7:41pm (AWST)
- 24th November 2026, 6:57pm (AWST)
- 24th December, 7:58pm (AWST)

Geminids Meteor Shower

When and where to look:

The peak of about 120 meteors/hour is from 11pm on 14th December. Viewing is from the north east and north about 20-45 degrees above the horizon. Keep an eye out for Jupiter which is also in the same area of sky. Nights either side of the peak are worth trying as well. The Geminids Meteor Shower is active from 4th to 17th December. There is a bit of moonlight that may impact the viewing of this year's Geminids. The Moon will rise at 1.10am (AWST) on 15th December, so viewing prior to this will be best. The Moon is less bright the next night which could improve viewing.

Consumer rights refresher for the busy shopping season

The biggest shopping season of the year is in full swing. From Black Friday to the January sales, one thing stays constant: your consumer rights.

A 50 per cent discount doesn't mean 50 per cent less protection. Even during a big sale, purchases must be fit for purpose, safe, durable and free from defects, and match its description. If it isn't, you are entitled to a remedy such as a refund, repair or replacement and that's regardless of the discount received. The type of remedy will depend on whether the issue is major or minor.

Around this time of year, Consumer Protection hears from shoppers who've been told 'sorry, no refunds on sale items' when they try to return something faulty. That's not how the law works. Your automatic guarantees apply whether you paid \$10 or \$1,000. In fact, 'no refund' signs are illegal because they falsely suggest you can't exercise your rights under the Australian Consumer Law (ACL). However, the ACL doesn't guarantee you a refund if you simply change your mind or purchase the wrong item, but if the store had this as their policy when the item was bought, they must honour their policy. A generous returns policy that allows change-of-mind returns can be helpful if you're buying a gift for someone.

Before you commit to spending your money, make sure you compare prices, read reviews and research the product. Not all sales offer genuine value but they must be honest and accurate. This means retailers are not allowed to mislead you about pricing and availability. The item must have been offered at the pre-sale price for a reasonable period so the discount being advertised is genuine.

Gift cards and vouchers are popular at this time of year and are a great idea for the friend or family member who can be hard to buy for. The card must have a minimum three-year expiry period clearly displayed, and businesses cannot charge post-purchase fees that reduce their value.

Other terms and conditions that come with gift cards can vary for every business, so it's best to check if there's any spending limits, how the business will give change if the full amount isn't spent, which stores accept the voucher (particularly important for shopping centre vouchers), if a lost or stolen card can be replaced and how to check the remaining balance.

If you're planning on buying a big-ticket item in the sales, don't forget that extended warranties are optional and may not provide additional rights beyond your automatic consumer guarantees. Ask what extra benefits these warranties actually offer before you hand over any extra money.

And finally, don't wait until the last minute to place your order if you're shopping online. Allow extra time for delivery and consider the impact delays could have. No one wants to turn up on Christmas day present-less.

The busy shopping season stretches from November right through to the January sales. That's a lot of opportunities to spend, so it's worth remembering your consumer rights and shopping smartly.

Compare prices, research products, and don't let urgency override good judgment.

In my travels I always meet people proud to tell me how they are doing their bit, using their personal skills, experiences and knowledge, to help make others aware that asking for help should be a natural reaction. These people are being creative. Telling others about a health issue and what they did rather than didn't do and are now OK. Some share how they are forever grateful describing that something that made them stop when on the brink of suicide or self-harm. Some have seen the change in another they know, stepped up and asked RUOK. Each of these people openly share their experience to make others aware, especially those in similar situations that you can get through. They make themselves vulnerable, thinking that they may be judged, only to find that the majority see only strength, really appreciating their message and encouragement.

I've seen the salt of the earth types, with the biggest hearts, nervously get up in front of people and tell how they got through a serious health scare or challenging time. How they feared being judged by others. They are passionate, using words from their heart, being who they are, sometimes not politically correct, but their message is very clear. Just do it, get that help. None are professional speakers or professional therapists; they are just legends telling their story their way to help and encourage others. Others arrange events just because they can and invite Rural Aid or another service to do a quick wellness talk. It does not matter if 5 people turn up or 50 people turn up, the message like a stone thrown into a pond ripples out into your community. I need more than two hands to count the number of people who have reached out for assistance after hearing about Rural Aid at the event or from someone who attended the event. You are not alone so be a legend.

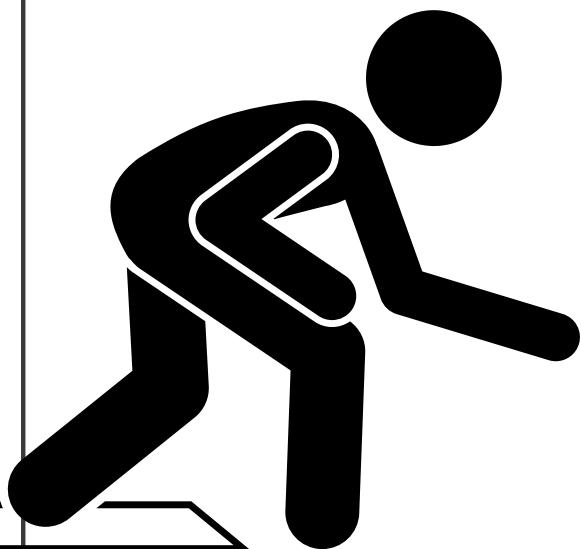

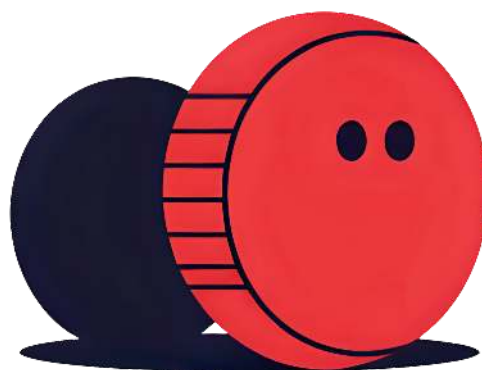

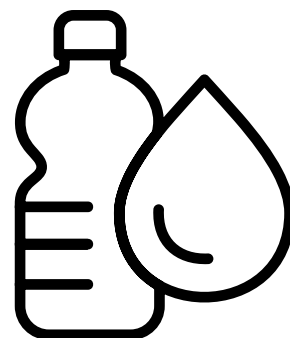
