The Courage to Heal: Braving the Path to Counselling.

Stepping into counselling is an act of real bravery. Asking for help isn't a weakness, it's the first step towards real change and healing. As a multidisciplinary practitioner, I want you to know that counselling welcomes everyone. It's a safe, respectful space for people of all backgrounds, identities, and experiences to find support on their journey.

It's normal to feel nervous about opening up your mind may try to protect you with emotional armour. But real change happens when you let yourself be seen and heard, without judgment. As trauma expert Dr Gabor Maté explains, when we carry old pain or trauma, our brains are more likely to see connection as risky or threatening. Even when it's safe. This is a natural response, not a personal failing, and it's one reason reaching out for help can feel so hard. The thought of letting it go can be terrifying, but you are safe on the journey to the other side of your pain.

Trauma and stress can make us avoid the help we need.

Healing starts when we face our pain and trust the process. Change is possible when we let therapy unfold. It's not a quick fix, but a journey to lasting relief and healthier relationships.

Three main patterns of distressing events can keep us stuck: betrayal, abandonment, rejection or neglect; abuse or bullying; and accident, injury or illness

We often repeat these unconsciously, doing them to ourselves, to others, or attracting people who keep the cycle going. While grief and loss are natural, lingering emotional upset often points to unresolved issues in these three patterns.

"Growth begins at the edge of your comfort zone, and relationships bring you there like nothing else." Brene Brown.

The good news is, you can change these patterns. Counselling can help you break free and start building a better life for yourself, your family, and even create a healthier workplace.

Not everyone will support your healing. Partners or others may try to put you off counselling because change can feel threatening or there may be trauma bonds. But real healing helps everyone break free from unhealthy patterns and leads to stronger, healthier connections with others and yourself.

Counselling gives everyone the chance to move beyond old patterns and build more genuine, fulfilling relationships.

Choosing counselling is an act of self-respect and hope. Know, your courage is the first step toward a freer, empowered, more connected life. Take that first step, stay the course. You deserve it!

Thinking of using a buyer's agent? Follow these tips

While you are probably familiar with real estate agents who represent a seller in a real estate transaction, you may not be so familiar with real estate agents who represent a buyer. In a market where there can be intense competition for properties some home buyers are using their own agent.

A buyer's agent can be helpful if you are unfamiliar with the market or want an experienced third-party to help you negotiate the sale price. You don't have to use them for the whole process of finding and buying a property, you can also choose to engage one for only some of the steps.

For a fee, a buyer's agent can find and assess suitable properties, attend inspections, liaise with agents, negotiate price and contract terms, explain contract conditions, arrange inspections, assist at auctions, and oversee settlement through to the final inspection.

There are a few questions you can ask to help you pick the right person for your needs. Firstly, and most importantly, [check they're licensed](#). In WA they must be licensed as a real estate agent or registered sales representative, which means a buyer's agent must be a fit and proper person and suitably qualified to understand the rules around real estate transactions.

It's also important to ask how long they've been in the industry and the experience they have in the suburb you wish to buy, what additional training they've done specific to being a buyer's agent, and how large their network of selling agents is.

Be careful when engaging interstate buyer's agents, as they may lack a strong understanding of WA's property market and processes. Before committing, ask about their experience purchasing property in WA, how many they've successfully negotiated locally, and what steps they've taken to understand WA-specific laws, contracts and procedures. It's also important to verify whether they are legally permitted to operate here by checking the [AMR register](#).

Once you have selected a buyer's agent you like, ~~you will need to sign~~ a written contract. You're free to negotiate the terms and fees before you sign but make sure it covers which aspects of the property transaction you want them to do and the total fee payable must be clearly shown. How you can end the agreement if you are not happy with their services should also be included.

If things go wrong, the good news is you're protected by the WA law governing real estate agents as well as the Australian Consumer Law (ACL). This means the buyer's agent's services must be provided with due care and skill, and within a reasonable time. If the service fails to meet the ACL, you may have the right to a refund, compensation or to cancel the contract.

You're also given extra protection through the [Fidelity Guarantee Account](#) if the licensed agent or their employee steals or misuses your money. This is why it's critical to check the buyer's agent is licensed correctly in WA.

Australians will receive mobile alert in July under new emergency trial

Most Australians will receive a mobile phone alert in July this year, as part of a nationwide test of a new emergency warning system.

For those of us that missed the memo and weren't aware:

Important information about the mobile alerts being tested in July.

The national alert will be sent to mobile phones across the country and will sound loudly even if devices are on silent or Do Not Disturb, meaning the sound can't be muted in advance.

Australians will receive nationwide mobile alert in July under emergency notification trial - ABC News

- A new national mobile alert system will begin trials this year, with the aim of delivering faster emergency warnings to Australians in times of disaster.
- The government initially promised the national messaging system would be ready by the end of 2024, but it is now expected to be operational by October.
- The system is designed for natural disasters such as bushfires and floods, but could be used for police operations and terrorist attack
- A nationwide test of the system will occur on July 27 at 2pm AEST, when everyone in Australia with a compatible mobile device will receive an alert

National phone alert safety warning for domestic violence survivors

If you are in a domestic violence situation and have a hidden or safety phone, consider giving it to a trusted friend or leaving it somewhere safe, such as at work or a friend, before July 27,"

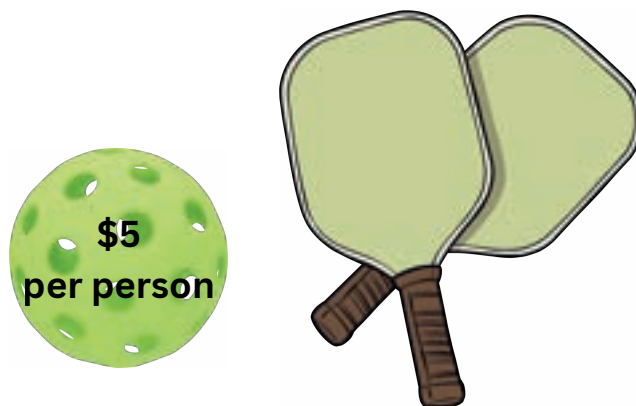

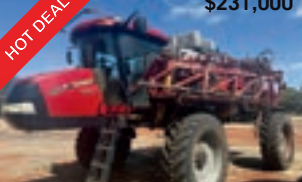
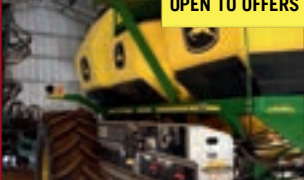
