

Yes, it is clear I am not a farmer but having been the Officer in Charge of Three Springs Police Station for over a year now I have developed an understanding of how a dry period can adversely affect a small regional town like Three Springs. The financial, emotional, mental and social strain during these periods can be immense and at times seemingly over whelming. The recent rains have bought a much-deserved respite for our community and I look forward to much more and a bumper farming season to come.

Congratulations are again in order for the Three Springs community as there hasn't been any criminal offences within the sub district during the reporting period. This is a tremendous result but we can't become complacent as a community. The next few periods will see significant events in and around Three Springs bringing large numbers of people to and passing though our town. It remains critically important to lock your doors, to secure your belongings and to report suspicious behaviour to the Three Springs Police on (08) 99544222 or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

With more people travelling through and around our town it remains as ever important that we all are abiding with the road rules. Three Springs Police and our policing hub partners in Mingenew, Morawa, Perenjori and Carnamah will be out in force over the coming weeks. We will be targeting speeding, seat belt, drink driving and mobile phone use whilst driving offences. We do this to ensure that everyone can get where they need to and back home safely. The fines and penalties for these types of offences seem to be ever increasing so if not for your own safety and for those around you think about your bank balance.

The Three Springs Magistrate Court will be in session again on Wednesday the 18th of March at the Three Springs Police Station. Members of the public are welcome to attend to see the judicial system in action.

Finally, I would like to thank the Three Springs Shire for their works around the town in enhancing the Three Springs town site. We have a great community and town here in Three Springs and we should take great pride in what we have and continue to ensure we keep it that way.



Three Springs – Biological Farming Round Table

Soil Health Day - 17th March 2020

The aim of the BFR is to initiate discussion on biological farming, helping farmers explore innovative, low input, regenerative, profitable, productive farming systems. The group supports each other's journey in an emerging regenerative agricultural paradigm where dominant conventional views can often be a barrier to change and success.

Anthony and Geraldine Thomas farm approx. 8000Ha in the North Midlands of W.A. Three Springs, 330 kms North of Perth, 160 kms South of Geraldton and about 80kms off the Coast. Anthony and Geraldine operate Hill Padua Polls, breeding multipurpose Merinos, and crop 1300Ha regeneratively. Adam Thomas operates that rest of the cropping program. In total approximately 3600Ha of crop is sown each year made up of Wheat/Barley/Canola and Lupins.

On pastures, 50kg/h of Guano was applied for three years from 2014 to 2017, and half a tonne of High Cal Lime and 5 L of NutriSoil p/Ha has been applied in the past two years.

Anthony has always been focused on soil health starting in the 1970's working with Agro Nutritional Research Laboratories run by the late Tom Arkley who analysed their soils and pastures. Arden Anderson has been another influence.

For the past two years Anthony's cropping system has included 15L/h of Flexi-N and 5L NutriSoil liquid inject at sowing, and again as a foliar at the five-leaf stage.

Anthony's lambing percentage is up to 130%, his wool cut is high, and growth rates of young sheep are excellent. Anthony equates these factors to caring for his soil health.



Guest Speaker - Charles Massy

Charles Massy is a Monaro wool grower, a scientist and a renowned author. His classic book The Australian Merino: The Story of a Nation is the account of how Merino sheep became one of the main supports of the Australian economy. More recently, Charles' **Call of the Reed Warbler: A New Agriculture, a New Earth** exemplifies his role as an advocate for regenerative agriculture.

NATIONALS COMMIT TO DEDICATED GERALDTON-BASED RESCUE CHOPPER

The Nationals WA will commit \$30 million towards establishing a dedicated emergency rescue helicopter in Geraldton if returned to government in 2021.

Leader Mia Davies joined local MP Ian Blayney, Moore MP Shane Love and other National party colleagues last week in the regional city to make the announcement.

"Having a rescue helicopter stationed in Geraldton would provide a life-saving service within a 240km radius along the Batavia Coast, inland through the Mid West and offshore to the Abrolhos Islands," Ms Davies said.

"This would greatly enhance emergency response coverage for 16 local government areas and almost 60,000 people throughout the Mid West.

"It would greatly assist first responders and support our volunteers in emergency situations, carry out search and rescue missions, primary care retrievals and aeromedical transfers.

"Reducing response times to traumatic injury is vital to saving lives - a chopper is instrumental to providing definitive medical treatment within the critical golden hour following an incident.

Ms Davies said \$30 million from *Royalties for Regions* would support the purchase and fit-out of the helicopter, as well as infrastructure upgrades to Geraldton Airport and construction of a landing pad at Geraldton Hospital.

"This additional infrastructure will allow for seamless patient transfers from the rescue chopper into other aircraft, ambulances or directly to the soon-to-be-upgraded Geraldton Hospital emergency department," she said

Moore MP Shane Love said the argument for the Mid West hosting a dedicated rescue chopper had strengthened over time and there was a strong case for future services to be considered in other regions.

"Investment in the Mid West has led to population growth and increased tourism with the Houtman Abrolhos and Kalbarri National Parks luring hundreds of thousands of visitors annually," Mr Love said.

"Basing a chopper in Geraldton will service fishing, resources, tourism and agricultural sectors, recreational boaties and will drastically reduce response times to road traffic accidents." he said.

WA currently has two dedicated rescue choppers stationed in Bunbury and Perth that together have flown more than 7000 missions. Almost 90 per cent of missions are to regional WA and 75 per cent are in response to motor vehicle and motorcycle accidents.

IN MOORE WITH LOVE

March 2020

I would like to firstly acknowledge the efforts of **Western Power crews** who have been extremely busy in recent weeks across the entire Moore electorate. Responding to the Premier's Statement in Parliament recently I raised a number of issues that all desperately need attention in Moore. **Power outages** remain a source of great frustration for Mid West residents and pole top fires this summer have seen services disrupted over a wide area and for days on end. Fire protection protocols adopted by Western Power in 2013 mean that power restoration now takes longer in regional areas. While there is a Total Fire Ban in place, Western Power will not reenergise lines and power outages can extend to several days while crews wait for fire danger ratings to drop.

There is an added safety risk associated with these power outages as many households are now dependent on mobile phones. Communications soon fail as **mobile tower battery backup** lasts only a matter of hours. In Parliament I raised this issue with respect to emergency communications during bushfires. Mobile phones remain an important communication tool for firefighters and the loss of mobile services means the DFES communication systems are also lost. Going forward, we need to consider how communications can be maintained in emergency situations.

Western Power's paltry \$80 **extended outage payment** offered to those without power for a 12 hour period or longer in no way covers the current day losses suffered during these lengthy outages. I have written to the Energy Minister, Bill Johnston asking that he consider changing the payment for each 12 hour interval without power, rather than a single event.

The Nationals WA will commit \$30 million towards establishing a dedicated **emergency rescue helicopter** to be stationed in Geraldton if returned to government in 2021. This rescue helicopter would provide a life-saving service within a 240km radius along the Batavia Coast, inland through the Mid West and offshore to the Abrolhos Islands.

The recent closure of the Batavia Health Practice in Dongara has highlighted the difficulty of attracting doctors to regional areas. Irwin Shire have worked to recruit a locum so that Dongara has a GP in place, but there are many regional centres all trying to recruit doctors at present and I believe the State Government needs to use Royalties for Regions funding to offer incentives to attract doctors to the regions. RfR funding was intended for this very purpose - to address inequities of service between regional and city communities. At their latest State Convention, The Nationals acknowledged the essential role of doctors in providing primary care in regional areas and moved a motion calling on the State and Federal Governments to immediately review the incentives and payments offered to GPs practicing in regional areas.

The Midlands Biosecurity Group (MBG) has contracted three Licensed Pest Management Technicians (LPMT's) or "doggers".

The LPMT's will work across land tenures over the next 12 months, providing co-ordination between neighbours' efforts in order to ensure that all control methods are strategic and impactful.

DO YOU KNOW WHERE YOUR DOGS ARE?

A surprising number of stock attacks are the direct result of domestic dogs being free to roam day or night. Ensure your domestic and working dogs are tied up or secure at night.

- Report all declared pest activity such as sightings and stock losses through the easy to use FeralScan app
- Complete a Restricted Chemical Permit application to get things happening on your property
- Become a member!
- Host a bait rack day or attend a workshop

PROTECT YOUR PETS AND FLOCK!

While doggers are active in the area it is crucial, now more than ever, that landholders ensure domestic and working dogs do not wander.

Buy a muzzle if you are concerned your dog may be attacking a neighbours flock. Many LPMT's discover domestic or working dogs to be the cause of stock losses.

To avoid your pets being trapped or poisoned while LPMT's are active in the Midlands region, please ensure your dogs are unable to wander from your property day and night.

REPORTING FERAL PESTS

Landholder reports are vital to direct the activities and accuracy of the LPMT's.

Every time activity is reported through FeralScan in the Midlands region, the MBG team receives an alert, which can then be acted upon.

Midlands Biosecurity Group Update

What is the Midlands Biosecurity Group (MBG)?

The MBG formed in 2019 as a new not-for-profit incorporated association that would focus on managing declared pests in the Midlands region. This region is defined as the Shires of Moora, Dandaragan, Coorow, Carnamah, Three Springs, Mingenew and Irwin.

Why was it formed?

The MBG's formation was driven by concerns from local landholders around a lack of a co-ordinated and multi-pronged response to declared pest species in the Midlands region. The group has prioritised foxes, feral pigs, rabbits and wild dogs given they are a common species throughout the Midlands region and have the potential to cause significant damage to crops and livestock in the region.

Previously, many individual landholders had been doing their bit to control pest species on their properties, however given the breeding potential of these pests and ready access to food and water on a landscape scale, the impact has been minimal with pest numbers increasing quickly.

A co-ordinated and strategic response is required to have a significant impact on reducing these pests. To achieve this, the MBG has personnel who can co-ordinate control activities across boundaries, both public and private, as well as assisting growers to implement multi-pronged control strategies. This includes trapping, baiting, shooting and in the case of rabbits biological control.

How will I get value from the group?

There is a number of ways landholders can get value out of the group. Firstly, the group will cover the cost of a Restricted Chemical Permit issued by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development. Given the dangerous nature of these control methods permits are required and landholders must complete online training. The MBG can assist with this.

Secondly, the group will provide access to baiting products to those who have completed a Restricted Chemical Permit.

And third, the group will provide access to a Licensed Pest Management Technician (LMPT), a trained and licensed professional who can assist farmers with pest identification, provide advice on control strategies as well assistance with implementing these strategies.

What is the best way to get involved with the group?

The first step is to become a member of the MBG. Full membership is open to all landholders in the seven Midlands Shires who own or manage over 100ha. Membership is free, however is beneficial for the group to ensure landholders are receiving information and updates about events and

activities in the region. It also gives you the opportunity to join and vote on the board of management at each Annual General Meeting.

W.A. Pensioner Free Travel Scheme

Pensioner Free Travel - FAQS

1 I have a Pensioner Concession Card from Department of Human Services (DHS) / Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take one free return or two free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

2 I have a Gold Health Card from Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take two free return or four free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

3 How do I register for Pensioner Free Travel and get my concession validated?

Complete the online registration form and attach images of both sides of your concession card(s). Alternatively download and print the registration form (PDF), complete and send to Transwa with photocopies of both sides of your card.

4 What do I do if I have a digital wallet instead of a concession card?

A digital wallet allows you to have your concession or health card with you everywhere you take your smart device. Transwa accept either the physical card or your digital wallet as evidence of your valid concession. When registering we ask for a photocopy or scan of your card. You can also screenshot your digital wallet and send us the image with your online registration form.

5 Why do I need to give Transwa consent to access my concession records held by Centrelink

We need your consent to enable the Australian Government Department of Human Services (Centrelink) to confirm the concession details you provide to the Public Transport Authority of WA (Transwa) when you register with us. The consent you give remains valid with Transwa unless you withdraw your consent by contacting us.

6 How do I book my pensioner free travel?

There are a number of ways to book your Pensioner Free Travel with Transwa once you have registered. Have your concession card/digital wallet handy and:

- Call us on 1300 662 205
- Visit us at one of our Transwa Booking Centres or visit one of our accredited agents
- Book online (available from late 2019)

7 What do I do if my travel plans change?

We know plans often change. To cancel or re-schedule your trip, call us on 1300 662 205 prior to the scheduled departure of the first leg of your journey and we will re-book or arrange for your Pensioner Free Travel entitlement to be reinstated.

8 Can I still use my WA Free Trip Vouchers from Centrelink or DVA if I have not registered with Transwa?

From 2020 you must be registered with Transwa to receive Pensioner Free Travel on Transwa services. Transwa will calculate your travel entitlement each calendar year and you will not need to provide a paper voucher.

9 Can I still receive a concession fare after I have used my free travel entitlements?

In addition to Pensioner Free Travel, WA Pensioner Concession cardholders and WA Gold Health cardholders can claim a 50% concession on all Transwa services.

10 Am I entitled to other travel entitlements if I live in the north of Western Australia?

If you live north of the 26th parallel in Western Australia and hold a Pensioner Concession Card or DVA Gold Health Card you may be entitled to other free travel options. Visit the Department of Transport for more details.

11 Do I need travel insurance?

Travel involves many risks and our liability to you may be limited in certain circumstances. We strongly suggest that you protect yourself by purchasing comprehensive travel insurance cover for (without limitation) loss of booking due to delays or cancellations, damage or loss to personal baggage and other items, personal liability, death.

RESIDENTS IMPACTED BY FIRE CAN CLAIM WATER REBATE

The State Government has clarified the Water Corporation policy in relation to charging water consumption of those impacted by bushfire this summer following questions by The Nationals WA.

Member for the Agricultural Region and former firefighter Hon. Martin Aldridge MLC recently confirmed arrangements for affected customers which will come as a fortunate turn for many regional residents who have been required to defend their homes and properties from fire.

"Water Corporation customers who have been impacted by fire and utilised scheme water for protection should contact the corporation and seek a rebate" he said.

Mr Aldridge confirmed the Water Corporation will provide a 20,000 litre (20 kilolitre) allowance for fire defence as well as a further rebate based on individual circumstances for extended periods of firefighting.

"I have heard first-hand the experience of constituents receiving excessively high water bills this summer as many actively defended their properties or prepared as fire neared their community." he said

"I will continue to monitor the Water Corporation's acceptance of claims for a fire water rebate over the coming months to ensure that customers are treated fairly."

To seek assistance Mr Aldridge encouraged all Water Corporation customers who may be eligible for a rebate to contact the corporation on 131 385.

Mr Aldridge reminds those living in susceptible areas to develop a bushfire plan as recommended by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services.

"Bushfires are unpredictable and unfortunately occur every summer. Being prepared is the key to survival, and it is why having a comprehensive plan in place will greatly improve the protection of your family, home and property." he said.

Having a 5-minute conversation about when will you know to leave, where will you go and which way to go could save your life in a fire emergency. For more information visit: www.dfes.wa.gov.au/firechat

The Nationals WA Spokesperson for Water, the Hon. Jacqui Boydell MLC reminded those living in bushfire prone areas that reticulated water supplies cannot be guaranteed in the event of an emergency.

"It is important that independent water supplies are considered in emergency events as water supply can be interrupted for a range of reasons." she said.

Beware the man in the middle

When it comes to email scams, many of us think of unsolicited and badly-spelt requests for money landing in our inboxes from dodgy email accounts.

But the reality is that email scams are now so sophisticated and believable they're almost impossible to tell apart from the real thing.

One such ruse is the payment redirection or 'man in the middle' scam, which involves a scammer pretending to be a legitimate company seeking payment to a bank account they control.

The scammer will secretly hack into your computer, or that of the business you're dealing with, and either alter bank details on an invoice or send a separate email saying they have recently changed bank accounts. Sometimes the fake invoice will come from the company's own email address (if it has been hacked), or from an address with a slight variation.

Often you won't realise you've been scammed until the genuine business starts chasing you for the money owed – and by then it is usually too late to recoup the funds.

It's a simple scam, but the consequences can be disastrous for individuals and businesses. Payment redirection scams tricked West Australians out of \$1.3 million in 2019, up 400% from the previous year.

Last year, a Yangebup association paid \$5200 – meant for suppliers who had provided services to a Carols by Candlelight event – into the wrong bank accounts, after a scammer hacked into their email account, changing the rules to divert invoices as they arrived. After altering the bank details, the invoices were then put back into the association's inbox to appear as though they came from the genuine suppliers.

It's important to stay vigilant to protect yourself. Check your email account rules regularly, and be suspicious if you receive correspondence from a company seeking to change bank account details. Use the correct, verified phone number from the company's website to confirm if the request is legitimate, or if emailing directly, type the known email address in the 'to' section, rather than replying to a received email.

If you notice any changes to invoices and banking details, report this to WA ScamNet, and contact your bank as soon as possible if you paid money into an incorrect bank account.

Also alert the other party about the scam, change passwords and perform a virus scan on any computer that may have received a suspicious email.






