And then the ever dependable Davies, capped it off with a fly past of their Tiger Moth.


I would also like to acknowledge our Community Action Group for baking and selling Anzac Biscuits. \$340 was raised for the RSL. Thank you.



Restrictions on the number of people at funerals

The State Government recently introduced provisions to restrict the number of people who could attend a funeral in WA. Further provisions were introduced on 7 April 2020.

Under the provisions:

No more than 10 people can attend a funeral.

- People who are needed to conduct the funeral, such as the funeral director and the funeral celebrant, are generally not included as part of the 10-person limit (unless in a small (indoor or outdoor) venue and impacted by prohibited gathering requirements).
- A person can apply to the State Emergency Coordinator (or delegate) for approval to allow more than 10 people to attend a funeral. This approval will only be granted if all proposed attendees at the funeral are *immediate family members* of the deceased.
- An *immediate family member* means only the partner or spouse (including de facto), parents, siblings and children (including stepchildren) of the deceased. Unfortunately, given current circumstances, immediate family does not extend to in-laws.

Social distancing requirements must still be observed at any funeral. A person can apply for approval for more than 10 people to attend a funeral, as long as at least four square metres of space for each person is maintained.

For more information on community activities such as funerals, please read the Closure and Restriction (Limit the Spread) Directions on the WA Government website.

Changes to applications for an approval

The process to apply for an approval to allow more than 10 people to attend a funeral has recently changed.

Applications for an approval will now be processed by the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries.

An application form for more than 10 at a funeral is available on our website.

To obtain approval, a request must be sent as early as possible to funeral.exemption@dlgsc.wa.gov.au or telephone 6552 1541 with any queries.


needs. This 24/7 service will enable local residents to make a doctors' appointment with an experienced, Australia-based HealthNow Doctor.

Call A Doc is a free telehealth service that provides diagnosis, prescriptions, referrals, care and

treatment for a wide range of conditions where you would usually visit your regular doctor.

The Health- Now Doctor can also prescribe certain medications and provide specialist referrals where appropriate.

While the Shires recruit a new GP for the area, the Call A Doc service has been activated to provide health care to local residents.



This service will initially run from Friday 10 April to Monday 8 June 2020, and

residents are encouraged to make use of this health service while a permanent GP is recruited.

Call A Doc is a HealthNow service made possible by Telstra Health. Telstra Health was formed in 2013 with the belief that technology can create a better connected healthcare system and make healthcare easier for patients and providers, especially for rural Australians. In July 2014 they launched HealthNow, Australia's first purpose built telemedicine centre, hiring experienced Australian-based doctors to make personalised care more accessible, at lower cost, to

deliver better health outcomes.

With the support of WA Department of Health, WA Primary Health Alliance and WA Country Health

Service, Call A Doc provides essential after hours and 24/7 health care to WA's Great Southern,

Wheat-belt, South West, Midwest and Goldfields regions.

COVIDSafe app

The COVIDSafe app speeds up contacting people exposed to coronavirus (COVID-19). This helps us support and protect you, your friends and family.

The COVIDSafe app is part of our work to slow the spread of <u>COVID-19</u>. Having confidence we can find and contain outbreaks quickly will mean governments can ease restrictions while still keeping Australians safe.

The new COVIDSafe app is completely voluntary. Downloading the app is something you can do to protect you, your family and friends and save the lives of other Australians. The more Australians connect to the COVIDSafe app, the quicker we can find the virus.

What COVIDSafe is for

The COVIDSafe app helps find close contacts of COVID-19 cases. The app helps state and territory health officials to quickly contact people who may have been exposed to COVID-19.

The COVIDSafe app speeds up the current manual process of finding people who have been in close contact with someone with COVID-19. This means you'll be contacted more quickly if you are at risk. This reduces the chances of you passing on the virus to your family, friends and other people in the community.

State and territory health officials can only access app information if someone tests positive and agrees to the information in their phone being uploaded. The health officials can only use the app information to help alert those who may need to quarantine or get tested.

The COVIDSafe app is the only contact trace app approved by the Australian Government.

How COVIDSafe works

When you download the app you provide your name, mobile number, and postcode and select your age range (see <u>Privacy</u>). You will receive a confirmation SMS text message to complete installation. The system then creates a unique encrypted reference code just for you.

COVIDSafe recognises other devices with the COVIDSafe app installed and Bluetooth enabled. When the app recognises another user, it notes the date, time, distance and duration of the contact and the other user's reference code. The COVIDSafe app does not collect your location.

To be effective, you should have the COVIDSafe app running as you go about your daily business and come into contact with people. Users will receive daily notifications to ensure the COVIDSafe app is running.

The information is encrypted and that encrypted identifier is stored securely on your phone. Not even you can access it. The contact information stored in people's mobiles is deleted on a 21-day rolling cycle. This period takes into account the COVID-19 incubation period and the time it takes to get tested. New restricted burning periods in place for April

Land owners in the southern half of the State who plan to burn on their properties in April will need to obtain a permit from their Local Government.

As of tomorrow, 1 April 2020, new Restricted Burning Times will come into effect for all 129 Local Governments from the Midwest Gascoyne through to the Great Southern.

The new timeframe extends through to 30 April 2020.

Residents in Local Government areas that planned to cease their Prohibited Burning Time on 30 April 2020 are unaffected by the changes.

Fire and Emergency Services Commissioner Darren Klemm AFSM said in these uncertain times the new timeframe would help reduce the potential of out of control burns for volunteer firefighters.

"We are still in the grips of an active bushfire season, and this risk is not likely to ease for a number of weeks," Commissioner Klemm said.

"Over the past two years fire crews have faced significant bushfires across southern WA at this time of year, many of which were caused by private burns that got out of control."

Commissioner Klemm said by obtaining a permit, and therefore registering burning intentions with Local Government, land owners would be helping their communities easily and quickly identify fire activities in their area.

"These restrictions mean Local Governments can ensure land owners who need to undertake burns, such as those in the agricultural sector for primary production purposes, can continue to do so while not putting unnecessary pressure on our firefighters," he said.

Dependent on the circumstances of the offence, land owners who undertake burning without the required permit can face fines of up to \$10,000.

WA's travel restrictions: COVID-19 coronavirus



Restrictions are in place to help stop the spread of COVID-19 Coronavirus around Western Australia.

Travel restrictions apply in Western Australia

- △ Travel across **regional borders**
- △ Travel to Esperance

- △ Travel to and around the Kimberley
- △ Travel to remote **Aboriginal communities**
- △ Travel to Biosecurity areas

You may qualify for an exemption

If you work in the transport, freight or logistics industries which continue to operate under these restrictions, or if you believe you fall within an exemption category, before travelling, you can apply for pre-approval to travel via the G2G PASS app.

Step 1 Go to WA.gov.au - Read about the travel restrictions and check if you are approved to travel to or around WA.

www.g2gpass.com.au

fill out the online form for pre-approval to travel, and submit.



Your application will be reviewed by WA Police.
Wait for an email confirming your exemption.



Receive QR Code

Download the G2G PASS application and receive your QR code directly to your mobile phone.

Prefer no App?

 Exempt travellers who choose not to download the app should continue to assist police at intrastate checkpoints by producing documentation to support the exemption, where possible.

Paper form

 For interstate travel and travel to Biosecurity areas of the Kimberley. Anyone who believes they meet the exemption criteria can still download an exemption application form from WA.gov.au if they choose not to use the app.

Checkpoints

 Checkpoints and mobile police patrols are in place to monitor travel across boundaries and ensure people are doing the right thing.

Best National Outcome for Mobile Coverage in Durack

21 April 2020

Forty four Durack areas will benefit from new and improved mobile coverage.

The Federal Member for Durack, the Honourable Melissa Price is thrilled that Australia's largest electorate with some of the most remote Australian communities has been so successful.

It has been announced today that Durack has been the most successful Australian electorate receiving funding for 44 new bases stations under Round 5 of the Morrison Government's highly successful \$380 million Mobile Black Spot Program.

"Durack regions can be confident that their business and community interests are receiving the attention they deserve benefitting from funding for improved mobile connectivity provided by these 44 new base stations," Melissa Price said.

"From Cunderdin North in the Wheatbelt to 3 Abrolhos Islands and Drysdale River Station on the Gibb River Road in the remote Kimberley, it is important that these communities receive the best 21st century connectivity available despite their isolation," Ms Price said.

"It's particularly good news at this challenging time of the conoronviarus pandemic when I know technology is proving even more vital for Durack families to connect, to access quality education, health services, and to do business globally," Ms Price said.

The Federal Government is contributing a total of \$34 million to Round 5 of the Program, which will deliver total new investment of more than \$73 million together with co-contributions from the funding recipients and state governments.

The announcement of successful Round 5 locations today brings the total number of base stations being funded under the Federal Government's Mobile Black Spot Program to 1,229.

Round 5 base stations are scheduled to roll out in the coming months with the first new base stations expected to be activated by the end of the year.

The Government intends that the next step in the Mobile Black Spots program will be to conduct a Round 5A, which will be used to test a range of different program designs. Funding for round 5A will be drawn from the unused portion of the funding allocated to Round 5.

West Coast Crays Get Wings

16 April 2020

A new agreement will see Western Australia's Geraldton Fisherman's Co-operative pack 18 flights full of Western rock lobster onto planes out of Perth over the next two months.

The major boost to the local west coast live crayfishing industry has been assisted by the Morrison Government, helping to secure an agreement that will see around 500 tonnes of local rock lobster headed for China.

The Federal Member for Durack, the Honourable Melissa Price believes it's an agreement that recognises the importance of the local seafood industry following the severe and sudden interruption to exports due to coronavirus.

"I welcome the swift response from the Morrison Government. This will keep many family businesses in Durack afloat and many local people employed in a much valued west coast industry," Melissa Price said.

"With demand from China starting to pick-up again, it's crucial our fishers can get their high-quality product back into these export markets so we can keep more Western Australians in jobs and generate extra export dollars for the state," Ms Price said.

Federal Trade Minister Simon Birmingham said the new agreement would be a job saver for an industry that had been hit hard by the COVID-19 crisis.

"We recognise the current crisis is placing immense pressure on Western Australia's seafood exporters, many of whom felt the earliest impacts when overseas demand began to dry up," Mr Birmingham said.

This initiative is part of the Government's \$1 billion Relief and Recovery Fund to support regions, communities and industry sectors that have been disproportionately affected by COVID-19.

Regional Travel Update

Intrastate travel restrictions in place

Intrastate travel restrictions will be in place from 11:59pm Tuesday 31 March 2020 to reduce the spread of COVID-19. These restrictions will prevent non-essential travel across regional boundaries.

Exemptions do apply to those travelling across regional borders for:

- work purposes;
- to transport freight;
- to attend medical appointments;
- to attend school or an educational institution (where necessary);
- to those who do not have access to groceries or supplies within their region
- caring for family members; and
- compassionate grounds.

The State Government would like to make it clear that the freight industry will continue to operate.

Main Roads Western Australia is supporting WA Police with the introduction of these new measures by establishing checkpoints, supplying lighting towers and toilets at required checkpoints and mobilising variable message boards (VMBs) to provide advance messaging to road users.

People are encouraged, where possible, to assist police by preparing documentation, such as a letter/email/SMS from an employer, to support their travel.

The WA public is advised to stay home, or if you are currently outside of your region, you should return home immediately.

National parks and temporary accommodation will also be closed to tourists.

Police have the power to issue fines to anyone who chooses to ignore the order.

W.A. Travel Restrictions Covid-19 (Midwest)

WA travel restrictions came into place midnight Tuesday 31/03/20

The Mid West is made up of 17 local government authorities:

Western Australians will not be permitted to leave their regional boundary. Police have the power to enforce these restrictions if necessary, and fines of up to \$50,000 can be issued. Exemptions will

apply in circumstances including employment purposes; medical or veterinary reasons; delivery of

essential services including health or emergency services; people living across regional boundaries, who may not have access to groceries or supplies immediately within their region; transport of goods; compassionate grounds; a family member has primary care responsibilities; for school, TAFE or

tertiary study reasons; to escape domestic violence or due to an emergency.

Additional restrictions to remote Aboriginal communities were announced by the Aboriginal Affairs Minister, to provide extra protection to these vulnerable communities.

New COVID-19 tenancy laws

Keeping a roof over everyone's head has never been more important as thousands of people suffer job losses due to the economic fall-out of COVID-19 coronavirus restrictions.

New laws are now in place to ensure renters can stay in their homes and businesses won't have to leave their premises, while recognising that landlords shouldn't be unnecessarily burdened. The emergency residential tenancy laws aim to provide some certainty during these uncertain times for those in private and public housing, residential long stay parks, as well as boarders and lodgers.

A six-month moratorium on evictions and rent increases is now law, meaning renters can't be evicted except in very limited circumstances such as causing damage to the property; posing a threat to the landlord or neighbours; refusing to pay any rent and refusing to make a rent repayment agreement; or if they abandon the property.

It is important to remember that this is a moratorium on eviction, not a moratorium on rent, meaning tenants who can afford to pay rent should continue to do so in order to avoid building up a debt that may need to be paid back when the moratorium ends.

Affected landlords and tenants are being urged to respectfully talk to each other and come to an acceptable agreement for the six-month period and beyond which could include a rent-free period, a decrease in rent or an affordable payment plan when the crisis is over.

If agreement can't be reached, Consumer Protection will be responsible for the mandatory conciliation of disputes between landlords and tenants.

It's useful for tenants to know that landlords do not have to carry out non-urgent repairs if they themselves are experiencing financial hardship due to COVID-19 but still have to make urgent repairs and restore essential services like gas and electricity if these aren't working.

For small commercial tenancies, a rental agreement also needs to be reached for the moratorium period and a code of conduct will provide a framework for negotiations and help businesses to survive the current financial crisis.

If there is any evidence of tenants or landlords abusing the moratorium, the Government has stated that it will not hesitate to introduce further laws that will deal with those circumstances.




