SHOW OF SUPPORT FOR COVID IMPACTED DURACK AG.

25 June 2020

The Morrison Government is spending \$36 million to support agricultural show societies recover from the effects of COVID-19, ensuring they can continue after the pandemic. The program will provide a one-off reimbursement to agricultural show societies to deal with cash flow pressures caused by COVID-19 related cancellation of agricultural shows.

Federal Member for Durack, the Honourable Melissa Price said the COVID-19 pandemic has hurt agricultural shows in Durack, with most being cancelled for 2020.

"Agricultural shows are an important part of the fabric of a large regional electorate like Durack, showcasing everything positive about our communities and local industries," Ms Price said.

"They create social bonds and, I believe, help improve mental health in parts of regional Australia where distance, and seasonal challenges and now COVID-19 cause significant hardship and distress. I am proud that the Morrison Government has recognised the importance of the continuation of these significant community events," Ms Price said.

Local agricultural show societies in the electorate of Durack could be eligible for a share of \$10 million in one-off payments to help them recover from the impacts of cancellations due to COVID-19. Eligible local shows could receive a reimbursement of up to \$70,000 under the Supporting Agricultural Shows program.

"The Morrison Government is reimbursing shows for costs incurred in 2020 and funds will be paid in 2021 and I encourage local show societies to check their eligibility and apply when the grants open," Ms Price said.

Funding is also being provided to support the cancelled agricultural shows in our capital cities to meet sunk costs and this is important as Royal Shows are a major opportunity for rural and regional Australians to showcase their produce and livestock to a wider audience.

STOP PUPPY FARMING BILL HAS TAIL THAT WAGS THE DOG

Moore MP Shane Love MLA says the State Government's Stop Puppy Farming bill has turned into a dog's breakfast after amendments to recognise farmers' needs for working canines were rejected by Labor. Mr Love said he strongly supported stamping out intensive puppy farming.

The proposed legislation however, caught too many in its net, including farmers who, if the bill is passed, will have to get local government approval to breed pups and ensure a supply of working dogs.

"Puppy farming is reprehensible – it is important we push for improved welfare for all animals and despite what the Premier claims, The Nationals don't oppose this bill, we just want to make it better," he said.

"However, this bill presented by the Labor Government impacts on farmers' ability to breed the specific type of dog needed in their work.

"By ensuring farmers could be granted exemptions to produce farm dogs, which is what The Nationals are seeking, WA would be in line with other States and the legislation would also recognise the vital role working dogs play in our agricultural sector.

"A working dog can be worth as much as \$40,000 to a farm business so the changes were critical to ensuring breeding stock wouldn't be compromised by the legislation.

"While the amendments were defeated last night we will continue to fight for these changes in the Upper House."

Mr Love said it was disappointing greyhounds were specifically mentioned in the proposed legislation but the same courtesy wasn't extended to farm working dogs.

Also The Nationals WA local government spokesperson, Mr Love put forward the amendments in Parliament after consultation with Dogs West, Pastoralists and Graziers Association WA, WA Farmers Federation and WA Local Government Association.

He wanted the legislation to exempt working dog owners and Dogs West members from being forced to become registered breeders. Farm dogs would also not be required to be sterilised after two years of age to allow mature breeding.

"Dogs West owners and breeders represent the highest possible standard of dog ownership in Western Australia," he said.

"They already have rigorous processes in place to ensure their membership has the highest standards of animal welfare in place, including restrictions on the number of dogs a person can own and the number of litters a dog can safely have.

"None of these animal welfare standards exist within the Labor Party's proposed legislation. "In addition, the Minister hasn't engaged with Local Government properly to ensure ratepayers don't bear the financial burden of this legislation."

I welcome funding of \$223 million from the Federal and State Governments for road upgrades and road safety projects, for 'shovel-ready' infrastructure. The \$7 million upgrade of Toodyay Road is long overdue and something that I have long advocated for. I was however disappointed that there has been no allocation for the Northampton bypass, desperately needed for road safety, heritage and amenity reasons. The \$100 million Regional Safety Improvement Program aims to reduce run-off-road crashes with works locally on Toodyay Road, Brand Highway south of Badgingarra and Indian Ocean Drive between Cervantes and Jurien Bay and between Nilgen and Lancelin.

The State Government must ensure motorists using the new Ellenbrook to Muchea section of the Tonkin Highway are not financially disadvantaged if their vehicles are damaged by the new road. My electoral office and Facebook page have been inundated with calls and comments from angry motorists whose vehicles had been chipped or dented by loose stones after this section of the NorthLink road was opened on 23 April. Main Roads has admitted the highway's secondary seal was carried out soon after the primary seal in cooler weather, resulting in stone dislodging from the chip seal. Damages of \$88,000 has been paid to 125 motorists with vehicle damage because of this section of road, with a total of 417 claims lodged to 10 June. Please contact my office if you are having trouble making a damages claim through Main Roads.

With intrastate travel restricted for many weeks due to COVID-19, Country Age Pension Fuel Card holders may well have not used all funds on their card before the 30 June deadline. The Nationals WA wrote to the Regional Development Minister, requesting that unspent funds be rolled over to next year's 2020-21 card. This would not involve any additional expense to the government - these funds have been budgeted for each year. The Minister has ruled this out, citing a diversion of State Government funding to help businesses survive and rebuild had been prioritized. The latest government quarterly financial report shows a \$200 million underspend in Royalties for Regions this year - unspent fuel card funds will add to this figure.

The opening of the Kalbarri Skywalk on 12 June was a fantastic event and a great celebration of a project made possible with Royalties for Regions funding. The Skywalk is accessible to prams and wheelchairs and offers magnificent views of the Murchison River Gorge. Designed so that it is compatible with the local environment and with input from the local Nanda people, the completed Skywalk is an absolute credit to all those involved and will be a great drawcard for tourism in the Mid West.

REGIONAL WA PALLIATIVE TO BE PUSHED INTO THE SPOTLIGHT

30 June 2020

The Nationals WA have welcomed the establishment of a Joint Select Committee into Palliative Care in Western Australia.

Nationals WA Deputy Leader and Member for Moore Shane Love MLA is a member of the Committee that will inquire into and report on a range of issues including the delivery of palliative care in regional WA. The deadline for written submissions to the committee is 10 July 2020.

Party Leader Mia Davies said the Committee would also look at recommendations for palliative care that arose during debate of voluntary assisted dying (VAD) legislation last year.

"The VAD legislation was monumental and our scrutiny of the bill put a spotlight on the vast discrepancy in resources and reach of palliative care in regional WA compared to the city," she said.

"Regional West Australians living with terminal illness and their families are regularly confronted with inadequate end-of-life services, meaning at a time they need support networks close by they often have to travel elsewhere in search of palliation.

"The formation of this committee gives our communities, health sector workers, advocacy groups and specialist stakeholders a chance to provide feedback on palliative care experiences so Members of Parliament better understand where investment can strengthen these important services."

Its terms of reference include inquiring into the progress of measures to ensure greater equity of access to palliative care services between metropolitan and regional areas and implementation of recommendations contained in the Joint Select Committee into End of Life Choices.

Mr Love said he was pleased to join five other Members of Parliament on the Committee, which is due to report back to Parliament in November 2020.

"We want people from all walks of life to be part of this important conversation and I congratulate the State Government on meeting its commitment to look closely at palliative care in WA." he said.

"When we leave Perth, the levels of disadvantage and restriction of access to medical treatment quickly emerge so I'm encouraged by this inquiry's focus on regional and remote WA

"I have no doubt about the need for palliative care and for it to be equally available to people in regional areas as it is in other areas."

Crop estimates vital for harvest planning

The CBH Group is calling on growers to help with vital harvest planning by providing crop estimates for the 2020-21 season as we improve the functionality of our online estimates technology, Paddock Planner.

The annual call for crop estimates signals the commencement of harvest preparations for CBH, with the information assisting with planning that will ultimately benefit growers with services and segregations that match the crops grown in their local area.

CBH Chief Operating Officer Ben Macnamara said understanding the commodity and size of crops being grown in each area helped CBH make the best decisions about what services to offer at receival sites during harvest.

"It is vital growers let us know what their plans are so we can estimate how much grain may be produced in a region and provide growers with the storage and handling services they expect at harvest," Mr Macnamara said.

"Estimates are particularly important this season given that some growers may have adjusted their barley cropping plans, and if so, we need to make sure that we're accommodating for those changes.

"We've also had examples in the past where estimates haven't been returned to us which means we weren't aware of additional volumes delivered to particular sites and this has impacted our service during harvest.

"As a result, this can cause frustration for growers and transporters during a really busy period and the potential for additional costs for both CBH and other growers."

This season, growers will have the option of submitting their estimates through Paddock Planner or the estimates form, both of which are accessed through our secure online portal LoadNet

Mr Macnamara said CBH encouraged growers to use Paddock Planner because the technology enables growers to manage their cropping plans and submit estimates for each paddock delivered to CBH. "We have added even more features to Paddock Planner this year including the ability to transfer property or paddock information to another account or to another grower, and the option to download information so growers can use this with other software." he said.

With growers estimates in Paddock Planner, CBH's planning capability is boosted so growers are provided with:

- segregations that match the grain types grown in their local area
- quicker deliveries at harvest, and
- additional storage, if it's needed

"Overall, Paddock Planner helps us provide growers with a more efficient network from paddock to port," he said.

Mr Macnamara said CBH would not offer an incentive to growers who use Paddock Planner this year.

"The incentive was offered last year to encourage growers to participate in the new technology and we subsequently achieved a high participation rate with over 70 per cent of hectares sown inputted into Paddock Planner," Mr Macnamara said.

"The information we were provided by growers in Paddock Planner helped greatly with our planning for last year's harvest and provided us with insights into where investment is needed in the network for the long-term.

"I can't emphasis enough how much our planning depends on the information that growers provide us in their estimates. I encourage all growers to please take the time to do theirs this year."

CBH is encouraging growers to submit their estimates before 31 July 2020. Growers who would like assistance with their Paddock Planner estimates are encouraged to call our Grower Service Centre on 1800 199 083.

Strike Energy Update


West Erregulla 3 (WE 3) Conventional Gas Well Drilling Civil Works to Commence in The Shire of Three Springs

As part of the Appraisal Plan for the West Erregulla field, Strike Energy will be drilling WE 3 during the second half of 2020. The Geraldton based contractor Lenane Nominees has been awarded the Civil works for the preparation of the drilling pad and access track at WE 3 commencing on 30 June 2020.

Strike Energy Ltd is Operator and holds of a 50% interest in the EP469 Joint Venture with Warrego Energy Ltd holding the remaining 50%. Most of the Permit is contained in the Shire of Three Springs (see map). Strike is also planning to drill up to two additional wells within the permit to broaden its understanding of the reservoir and provide the basis for the Phase 1 gas project.

Strike recently announced that it has selected leading Australian gas infrastructure provider AGIG to commence FEED for a build, own and operate 50 terajoule-a-day gas plant (Phase 1) to process West Erregulla raw gas for sale into WA's wider gas network. The conventional gas wells have the potential to provide affordable natural gas to domestic markets and realise the option agreement with Wesfarmers for their fertiliser facility in Kwinana. During construction this project anticipates creating more than 100 jobs.

Don't get taken for a ride by tow trucks

It's hard to keep your wits about you following a car accident – you're often in shock, the traffic behind you starts piling up and all you want is to get the car off the road and away from the scene.

Sighting an approaching tow-truck can therefore be a great relief, but there are things you should know before a breakdown or bingle occurs to avoid being stung financially.

The first tow truck on the scene does not have an automatic right to your car – you have the right to decide who tows your vehicle and where it is taken.

Tow truck drivers are legally obliged to give you a completed standard Authority to Tow Form before towing, so always make sure to read the fine print and never sign it if parts have been left blank, such as the total cost of towing and storing your vehicle.

Some consumers have been caught-out by signing forms that lock them into having the car repaired by a particular repairer or giving a lawyer permission to act on their behalf.

It pays to be prepared – check your insurance policy to see what it covers and for instructions on what to do if you are in an accident.

Better yet, keep the number of your insurer on your phone and in your vehicle so you can easily contact them for advice immediately following an accident.

In the past 12 months, we have received 14 complaints about tow trucks, mostly relating to 'excessive' fees and charges.

Our advice is to make sure you know the total cost of the service before you agree to have your car towed.

Rounding issue is no small-change

The next time you're paying via 'tap-and-go' at the supermarket, petrol station or drive-through, double-check the machine to see if the retailer has rounded up the total price – if so, then this is a problem.

Rounding up or down to the nearest 5 cents was introduced for cash payments almost 30 years ago when the 1 cent and 2 cent copper coins were taken out of circulation.

But with cash payments now dwindling in favour of electronic transactions, there is no need for a retailer to round up your \$19.99 purchase to \$20, unless you are handing over a \$20 note.

The payment is occurring electronically when you're paying via debit or credit card, meaning the exact amount can be processed and debited from your account.

While one or two cents might not seem like a big deal to an individual, this extra money can add up for a business conducting hundreds or thousands of transactions each week.

It is an offence under Australian Consumer Law for a business to break the rules surrounding small change, as rounding-up (or down) on electronic purchases may suggest items are not available for the advertised price, which in turn breaches your consumer rights.

For cash payments only, the following rules apply:

- 1 & 2 cents rounded DOWN to the nearest 10
- 3 & 4 cents rounded UP to the nearest 5
- 6 & 7 cents rounded DOWN to the nearest 5
- 8 & 9 cents rounded UP to the nearest 10

If you spot a retailer breaching the rules for electronic purchases, you should ideally broach it with them at the point of sale. If you only notice after walking away, then go back and request a refund.



Stargazing Tips





If you look to the stars in July, you'll see two beautiful gas giant planets shining at their brilliant best for observing. It's Jupiter and Saturn of course! This month, both will be at what astronomers refer to as "opposition".

"Opposition" is a word that astronomers often use. A planet is said to be in "opposition" when it is on the opposite side of Earth to the Sun. Opposition happens once a year and it means that the planet is as close as it gets to Earth for the year which makes for great viewing.

When and where to look: Both planets can be seen with the naked eye from 7.30pm. Jupiter is the brightest star-like object in the east and Saturn is just below on the horizon. Jupiter is at opposition on 14th July. Saturn comes into opposition a week later on 21st July.


