ASTROTOURISM RETURNS TO THREE SPRINGS

Last Thursday saw over 30 people attend the first Astrotourism event held in WA since COVID-19 started. Galaxy Girl Carol Redford gave a presentation on why WA has the best night skies in the world, as well as handing out planispheres to the children and showing them how to use them.

A member of the StarGazers Club WA gave a pointer tour of the night sky, as well as talking about how different constellations got their names. There were fantastic views of Jupiter and Saturn, as well as Scorpio and the Southern Cross. Satellites could be seen with the naked eye, and there was even a fireball (shooting star or meteorite) which was reported by Galaxy Girl to UWA. Members of the public got to view the sky through 4 massive telescopes.



Shops caught selling dangerous Turkish-style lamps

With their ornate design and intricate mosaic patterns, it's hardly surprising that Turkish-style lamps are a popular decorative feature in many Western Australian homes.

But just because they are beautiful, it's important to remember that lamps are an electrical item that can pose a serious safety risk if they haven't been approved for sale in Australia.

Our colleagues at Building and Energy – WA's energy safety regulator – recently issued infringement notices of \$5,000 each to two retailers after a site inspection revealed some Turkish-style lamps in the stores lacked the required electrical safety certification labels.

Some of the non-compliant lamps had dangerous defects including damaged wiring inside the curved metal tube and no earth pin, which is compulsory for electrical items cased inside metal.

Faulty electrical items can cause shocks or fires, so for this reason all electrical appliances sold or hired in Australia are required to be independently assessed as having a safe design that complies with Australian electrical standards.

It doesn't take long to check whether an item is certified – look for an approval number or a regulatory compliance mark (a tick in a triangle) on all household appliances and their plugs.

Certification can also be confirmed by searching for the model number on the Electrical Equipment Safety System website at eess.gov.au

We all expect the electrical appliances we use to be safe, so it is vital that everyone plays their part to ensure that unregulated household electrical equipment is not sold or used in Australia. This applies when shopping in-store as well as when ordering items online.

Students should exercise caution over VET courses

Job losses have been an unfortunate consequence of the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic, but with things now looking brighter, some Western Australians are taking steps to upgrade their skills or learn a new trade altogether.

Committing to study and signing up to student debt are big decisions, especially in these uncertain times, therefore we are urging prospective students to only use a nationally recognised and accredited private college or TAFE.

On 26 May 2020, the Federal Government announced its Job Maker plan, which aims to reform the vocational education training (VET) sector to provide Australians with more opportunities to find work.

While this is welcome news, it's important that lessons are learned from the issues encountered with the earlier VET FEE-HELP loan system, under which the government covered upfront costs for students going into vocational training.

Alleged inappropriate behaviour by some providers saw many students left with large debts after being signed-up to courses over the phone, door-to-door and at shopping centres.

Some were unaware that they were going to incur a student loan for thousands of dollars, as they were told the courses were free or they did not have to pay for the course.

Many of these people later found out that they had signed up for a course they did not want to do or were unable to complete, which left them with a huge student loan debt.

Registering for study should be a hassle free experience, so be wary of door-to-door sales people trying to pressure you into signing up for a course. If you do not wish to deal with uninvited door-to-door sellers, you should display a Do Not Knock sticker on your front door or near the doorbell.

There are hundreds of training providers around the country who offer courses online, on campus or as a mixture of both. A search for registered training providers can be carried out on the Federal Government's My Skills website - www.myskills.gov.au.

WA consumers who want to check if they have student debt should visit their <u>MyGov</u> account. To apply for VET student loans, or to make an enquiry or complaint, visit the Commonwealth Ombudsman website - <u>www.ombudsman.gov.au</u>.

Nationals WA vow to increase value of pensioner fuel card

Moore MP, Shane Love MLA says the Country Age Pension Fuel Card will be boosted if The Nationals WA form government next year.

Mr Love said card values would be lifted from \$575 to \$600 from next July and then re-linked to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) each year thereafter.

"There are nearly 4,000 cardholders in Moore who will benefit from this overdue lift in card values." he said.

"With extra value the cardholders can get out with more confidence – and considering the months of COVID-19 restrictions it is important our pensioners re-engage with their communities.

"The Country Age Pension Fuel Card is a flagship Nationals WA policy introduced in 2009 that has provided great support for regional pensioners to be more active and connected with friends, loved ones and their community.

"It also goes some way to acknowledge that regional pensioners do not have access to free or heavily subsidised public transport as those living in the metropolitan area do."

Recent analysis of fuel prices carried out by The Nationals WA showed motorists in regional areas continue to pay more on average at the bowser than those in Perth and many have limited or no access to public transport.

Speaking also as The Nationals WA Deputy Leader and community services spokesperson Mr Love said \$20 million of Royalties for Regions funding would be used to boost the Country Age Pension Fuel Card.

"Our commitment recognises that regional pensioners continue to go without access to subsidised or free public transport enjoyed in metropolitan areas and brings card values up to a contemporary level," he added.

"We will also replace the issue of annual cards with a permanent card, saving an estimated \$2.3 million in production and distribution costs, as well as allowing for the immediate recharge of card values each new financial year.

"Our policy will help more than 55,000 card holders get out and about in their communities more – which after months of COVID-19 restrictions is more important than ever."

DEAR MOORE RESIDENTS...

COVID-19 has certainly made for an unusual start to the year. The pandemic brought a level of disruption that we could not have predicted. Many events, shows and field days have been cancelled this year – all opportunities when I would ordinarily meet many of you. In the absence of these events, please don't hesitate to contact me for assistance with any government-related matters. You will find my office contact details below.

As your Member for Moore, I bring a breadth of experience in community service, small business and agriculture and have lived and worked in regional WA most of my life. I attended high school in Albany and completed a Bachelor of Commerce from the University of Western Australia. I was a local government councillor for more than 12 years, including Shire President of Dandaragan from 2004 until 2013.

I have served in a range of regional and local organisations, including as a director of the Northern Agricultural Catchments Council, as a board member of the Wheatbelt
Development Commission, a member of the
Wheatbelt Regional Advisory Planning
Committee, the West Midlands Natural
Resource Group, the Central Coastal
Business Enterprise Centre Board and
even the Badgingarra School Council.

I was elected as The Member for Moore in 2013. In 2014, I was appointed Parliamentary Secretary to Minister for Regional Development and Lands and held that position until the change of government in 2017. In Parliament I have served on the Economics and Industry Standing Committee and the Education and Health Standing Committee.

I am also currently serving on the Joint Select Committee on Palliative Care. I was an Acting Speaker of the Legislative Assembly from May 2017 to March 2020 and the Nationals WA Whip from March 2017 to March 2020.

In March 2020 I was elected Deputy Leader of the Nationals.



RESTORING ROYALTIES FOR REGIONS

The Royalties for Regions program was brought to government by The Nationals WA in 2008. Under our stewardship, \$7 billion invested in 3,600 programs and projects changed the face of regional WA. These were funds generated in regional WA that were specifically set aside for regional communities under the Royalties for Regions Act.

Since 2017 the McGowan Labor government has diverted Royalties for Regions funds to other areas and underspent what was left. The latest quarterly financial report tabled by the McGowan Labor government shows there is a \$200 million underspend in Royalties for Regions this year. These unspent RfR funds will flow into consolidated revenue and be banked as part of the overall public bank account.

Regional WA has been robbed of hundreds of millions of dollars – money that is now likely to be ploughed back into Perth projects such as Metronet. Over the next four years another \$1.6 billion is forecast to be lost to regional WA. RfR is now just a shell of the original program in place under the Nationals in government, with funds diverted to pay for orange school bus services, remote power and water services, regional education assistants and underwrite TAFE courses.

The Nationals WA want to restore Royalties for Regions to its full potential with a fair share of the State's royalties going back to make our towns and cities better places to live, work and raise a family.




