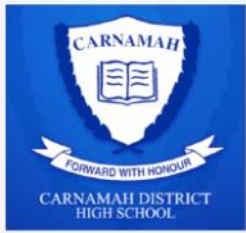

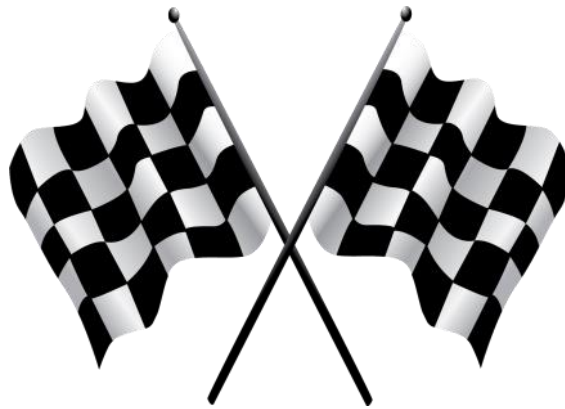

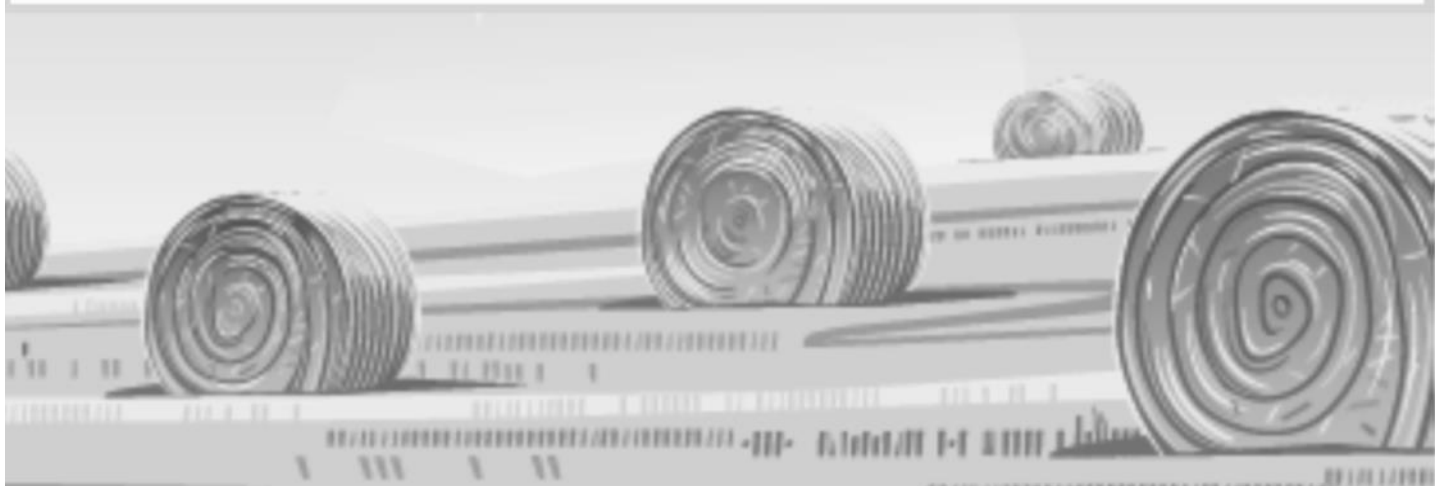

WILD DOG CONTROL BY VOLUNTEERS ON GOVERNMENT LAND

The Nationals spokesperson for Agriculture, Colin de Grussa has expressed his alarm at the recent actions by the McGowan Government to effectively transfer all legal liability and risk for the control of wild dogs on government land to Recognised Biosecurity Groups (RBG).

Under a proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) issued to RBGs by the Department of Biosecurity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA), the RBGs will be required to take on the responsibility for all permits related to dog control activities on land managed by the Department.

Since the inception of RBGs, these permits have always been held by DBCA, as they are ultimately responsible for controlling wild dogs on the land they manage, including unallocated crown land.

"What the McGowan Government is essentially doing is forcing a group of volunteers to take on all legal responsibility for wild dog control activities on land that is owned and managed by the government" Mr de Grussa said.

"This is an extraordinary set of circumstances. In May the Government was lauding the important role played by RBGs in protecting the State's \$1.6 billion sheep industry from wild dogs whilst, at the very same time, treating them with absolute disdain by forcing them to take on a responsibility which is absolutely inappropriate for a group of volunteers".

Mr de Grussa also said the government seems to have forgotten that these volunteers are essentially doing work that the DBCA should really be doing. However, they are caught in a no win situation, knowing that if they don't control the wild dogs on government land, nothing will be done and the horrendous injuries inflicted by the dogs on livestock will not only continue, they will increase.

"The Minister for Environment needs to sort this mess out as a matter of priority. RBGs and the volunteers involved need the Minister's support, not bureaucratic buck passing where the Government has completely walked away from their responsibilities." Mr de Grussa said.

Short term [rentals – look before you lease](#)

If you've got a spare room or investment property, you may be considering advertising the space for short-term renting to make some extra money. Or perhaps you're a local travelling across WA, who's on the look-out for somewhere to stay that's different to what's on offer from traditional accommodation providers.

Whatever your motivation, it's clear that Western Australia's short-term rental market has been a game-changer for the state's tourism industry over the last few years.

As a result, the State Government is looking into the regulation of short-term renting in WA and will be introducing a new registration scheme.

In the meantime, there are important things you need to know if you're involved in the industry, which is why we have launched a public education campaign and new web page explaining the rights and responsibilities of hosts, guests, real estate agents and those looking to buy or sell a short-term rental property.

If you're a host, it's smart to be aware of your obligations surrounding the truthful marketing and presentation of your property, any council or strata laws, insurance cover, as well as your responsibilities to keep visitors safe.

Guests should know they have rights under the Australian Consumer Law, read the booking platform's terms and conditions before deciding, and know where to go if they have a complaint.

Should you be looking to buy a property to lease as a short-term rental, it's best to explore whether any approvals are needed or if there are rules stopping the use of the property as a short-stay, such as strata laws.

If you're selling a property, it might be appropriate to tell your agent if it's been used as a short-term rental as this may important information for potential buyers.

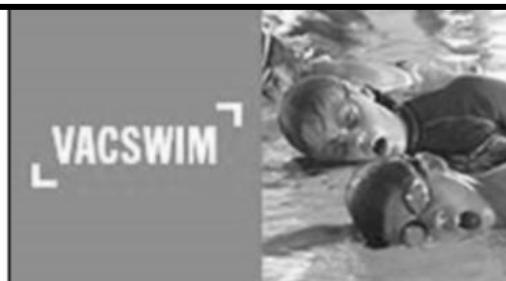

Labor Government fails to address bigger issue over worker shortages

Member for Moore Shane Love MLA says the Labor Government's regional worker incentives won't stretch far enough to help many businesses in Moore struggling under COVID-19 restrictions.

Mr Love said while the Government had to be dragged kicking and screaming to provide assistance for the agriculture sector, there wasn't any help for other industries facing chronic workforce shortages.

"I am concerned for the fruit and vegetable growers in Moore who have perishable produce to harvest," he said.

"Haulage companies are warning there won't be enough drivers to transport goods while hospitality venues and retailers are restricting opening times without workers they need.

"The Labor Government has forgotten about many of our local businesses and their futures are in jeopardy without a plan to increase regional workforces."

Mr Love said the regional worker incentives announced by the Minister for Agriculture didn't help farmers and growers whose seasons will be compromised by a shortage of skilled workers.

"The Nationals strongly support the hard border as a means to keep COVID-19 out of the State but exemptions were always part of the process to ensure businesses – and the economy – kept ticking over," he said.

"However, the Labor Government has let many sectors down by its haphazard planning and inability to develop a gateway to get skilled employees into State."

Leader Mia Davies said industry and The Nationals WA had been raising the worker shortage issue with Government since March to little or no avail.

"The \$3 million package to lure workers to an agricultural sector worth \$10 billion was miserly and may be too little, too late," she said.

"There are nearly 1500 fly-in fly-out workers coming in and out of the State to service the mining sector, and now industry is asking for more assistance to meet their workforce requirements.

"Yet when it comes to helping agriculture the Government sits on its hands and avoids finding a gateway for essential staff."
