BOOSTING INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR DURACK

14 OCTOBER 2020

New measures in the 2020-21 Budget will make it easier for projects in Durack to access Australian government funding to help create jobs and economic development across northern Australia.

Federal Member for Durack, the Honourable Melissa Price, has welcomed the reforms following a review of the Northern Australian Infrastructure Facility (NAIF).

"The reforms will speed up funding decisions and widen the scope of projects eligible for funding. The changes followed a widespread review of the \$5 billion NAIF program, and the government decision in July to extend NAIF's operations for five years until mid-2026," Ms Price said.

"We have listened to communities across the north and we are making changes to ensure NAIF has the flexibility it needs to further drive economic activity, create jobs, drive population growth and open up new opportunities for people across northern Australia," Melissa Price said.

NAIF funding has already made a significant impact on developments in Durack, assisting operations like Strandline Resources Gascoyne development, one of the world's largest mineral sands projects, announced in July.

The changes to NAIF will make sure more factors, including local jobs, regional income, and opportunities for local suppliers, Indigenous business and communities are considered.

To date, NAIF has invested around \$2.4 billion in projects in health, education, resources, energy and agriculture, supporting more than 7,200 jobs in Australia's north and supporting around \$4.4 billion in total project value.

Men's Sheds can apply for financial support across the following funding categories:

Your rights when a business goes bust

While many Western Australian businesses have re-opened and returned to 'business as usual', there are fears some will not survive the financial impact of the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic.

When a business closes its doors, consumers often call Consumer Protection with concerns about money paid for goods or services that are yet to be received, or unspent gift vouchers or credit notes.

How consumers and creditors are affected when a business goes bust depends on the circumstances of each case.

If the business is a company, it becomes insolvent and can be put into voluntary administration where steps are taken to save it. Should that fail, the next step is often liquidation where the company's affairs are wound up in an orderly way and assets distributed to secured creditors.

When it comes to sole traders, the rules are different – because the business is tied to the individual owner's income, the individual would declare personal bankruptcy.

If there is money left after paying secured creditors such as employees and loan providers, you as a consumer are an unsecured creditor who may have the option of either claiming your products or trying to get your money back.

To claim your products, you must have paid in full (or pay the liquidator the balance) and have a receipt or some other proof of purchase.

Should you want a refund and paid by credit card, contact your card provider and request a chargeback as soon as possible because time-limits apply. If you didn't use a credit card or are unable to claim the product, you can register with the administrator or liquidator as an unsecured creditor.

With a number of businesses facing financial difficulty during these uncertain times, Consumer Protection advises consumers to reconsider the purchase of gift-cards.

To find out who the administrator or liquidator is, contact the Australian Securities and Investment Commission (ASIC) - <u>insolvency notices</u> on ASIC's website. You can also find out through newspapers or on the company's website.

New Code gets fitness industry into shape

Gone are the days where a gym is the only destination available for fitness lovers looking for a structured work-out.

Nowadays, you can find boot-camps in local parks, employ a personal trainer or even stream 'virtual' work-out sessions online from the comfort of home.

Whichever exercise method best suits your lifestyle, there's little doubt Western Australia's fitness industry has undergone a major revolution in recent years and the legislation is now catching up to provide better consumer protection for all involved.

Due to take effect on July 1 2021, the updated mandatory Fitness Code was developed after extensive consultation with the public and industry and will introduce a number of changes to how fitness providers conduct their business. The cooling-off period for contracts will be extended from 48 hours to seven days, meaning consumers will be able to cancel a contract within a week of signing up, while transparent pricing will make it easier to compare the value of different fitness services.

Membership agreements are to include a summary statement to help consumers understand their responsibilities and state whether it involves an ongoing month-to-month renewal or is a fixed term contract of no longer than 12 months. Given the cancellation of gym memberships continues to raise issues for consumers, a number of changes have been made to simplify this process. No longer will consumers need to arrive in-person to cancel their memberships – they can now cancel online in the knowledge this will result in the immediate termination of direct debit arrangements.

Fitness providers will also need to notify members before the automatic renewal of their memberships so they can cancel without penalty.

When it comes to cancellation fees, these must be fully disclosed in the contract and are required to reflect the reasonable administration costs associated with the termination of the agreement.

Given Consumer Protection has received 1,000 enquiries and complaints about the fitness industry in the last two years, we hope the new Fitness Code will go a long way towards preventing many of the common grievances.


