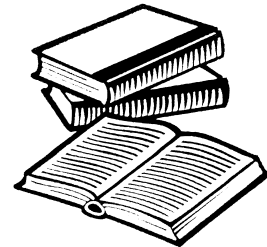

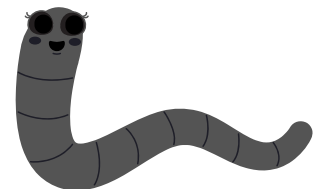
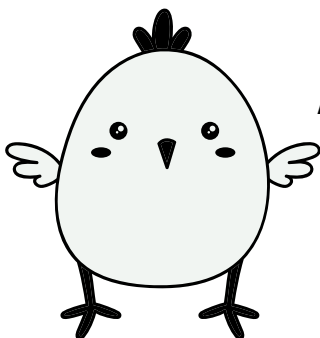

Give pet scams paws for thought

Cute photos of puppies and kittens have been used by scammers for years to dupe prospective pet buyers out of their hard-earned money and it's only getting worse.

In Western Australia last year, our WA ScamNet team received 114 reports of pet scams, with 75 victims losing more than \$216,000 – a three-fold increase on both the losses and victim numbers reported five years earlier in 2017.

Most pet scams begin with online searches for animal breeders, or advertisements that appear on online marketplaces and social media, with images or videos often stolen from legitimate websites.

Although the ad may suggest the seller is local, when contacted they will say they are outside WA or located remotely and the animal needs to be transported. This tactic is used to get you to pay more money for fake shipping fees, airfares or travel insurance.

The biggest red-flag that you're dealing with a scammer is the method of payment, with money sent via bank transfer unlikely to be recovered. Don't be fooled by Australian bank account details either, as scammers are known to use money mules to look more legitimate.

For this reason, we recommend only paying via credit card or a secure payment platform like PayPal as there's potential to get your money back if the animal never turns up.

Other warning signs are limited contact, no address details on the website and false claims of being a registered breeder that can easily be verified.

With so many downsides to buying a pet online, it is generally safer for consumers to shop locally so they can personally inspect the animal and meet its owner. Consider going through legitimate breeding organisations such as Dogs West or the Cat Owners Association to verify breeder information and registered contact details, or give serious thought to adopting through a shelter or rescue centre.

Spotlight on hidden fees

Every cent counts during the current cost of living crisis, so it can come as a shock to discover extra fees or charges have been added to a purchase before checkout, or tacked on to the receipt after paying.

Hidden fees may come in a number of disguises, so it's important to know what to look for and understand your rights to avoid spending more than you'd initially planned.

Pre-selected extras are becoming more common as food delivery apps and self-service QR codes in restaurants replace ordering in-person, or when events and flights are booked online. These apps and websites can be set to automatically charge a tip or for other extras, unless the customer removes these options before paying.

Under the Australian Consumer Law (ACL), businesses are allowed to add pre-selected tips and optional charges to your bill – in a practice known as 'drip-pricing' – but only if the additional prices are disclosed at the beginning of the purchasing process.

To avoid accidentally leaving a tip, or being stung for other add-ons, it's important to keep an eye out for any preselected extras included in the total price and deselect anything that's not wanted before making payment.

If you are misled into paying an optional charge, then raise this with the business and request a pro-rata refund to the value of that added charge.

Another common issue we hear about is payment surcharges for simply using your credit, debit or EFTPOS card, rather than cash.

Card surcharges are permitted under the ACL, however the fee must only reflect what it actually costs the business to process the payment, such as bank fees or terminal costs. If a business charges a payment surcharge, it must be able to prove the costs it is based on.

Should a business not accept cash – or fail to provide another way for consumers to pay without incurring a surcharge – the fee must then be included in the total cost.

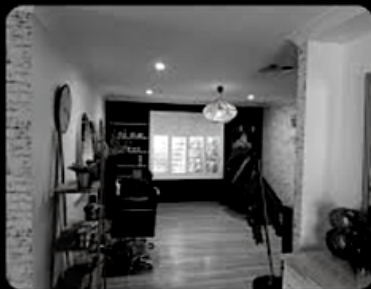

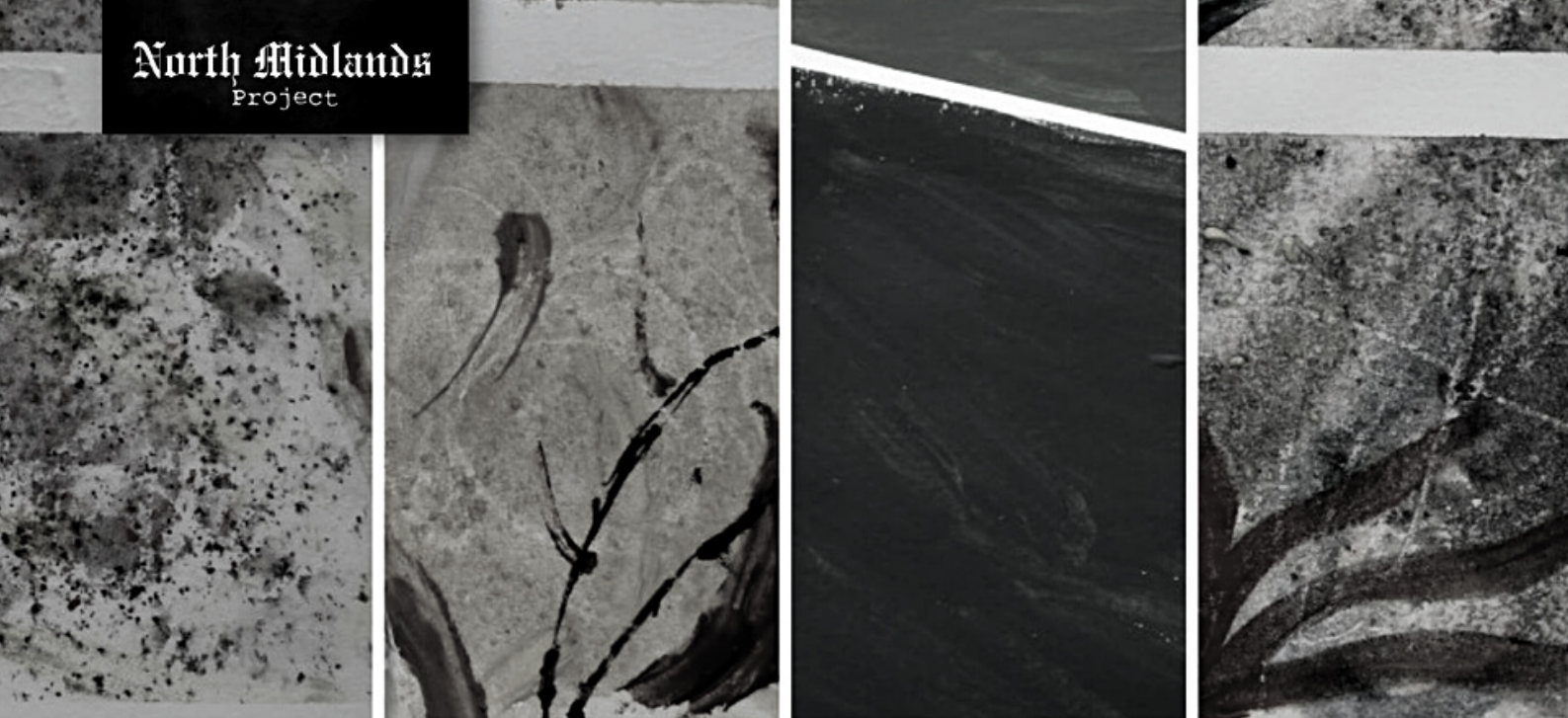

The Equinox & Star Clusters

The equinox marks the transition from summer to autumn in the southern hemisphere and has almost the same number of hours of daylight as darkness!

Equinoxes happen twice a year and on the dates of the equinox, the Sun is exactly above the Earth's equator, causing the equal length of night and day. The equinox marks several astronomical phenomena too! During the equinox, the Sun will rise directly in the east and set due west. The Sun will also appear exactly halfway between its northern most and southern most location in the sky. The exact time of the equinox occurs when the sun is directly above the Earth's equator, for 2023 this will occur at 5:24am for West Australians.

The Autumnal equinox for the southern hemisphere will occur on the 21st of March.

For some fun stargazing, the quarter Moon makes a close approach to Mars from March 26, and on the 28th will be just below the red planet. For those with telescopes or high-powered binoculars, the Shoe-Buckle Star cluster can be seen above Mars, and the January Salt-and-Pepper Star Cluster can be seen below the Moon.

When to look: 7pm to 9.30pm, 28th of March.

Which direction to look: In the western sky.

Something Interesting: Star clusters are lovely astronomical objects to view, often distinguishable with special shapes and patterns. The Shoe-Buckle Cluster is an open cluster located in the constellation Gemini. The cluster is approximately 2,800 light-years away from Earth and contains approximately 200 stars.

We will have more stargazing tips and helpful hints throughout the year so keep looking up and marvel at our clear, dark skies.

Stargazing Discovery Tour to promote dark sky tourism to eclipse chasers

Astrotourism WA has released a series of 22 dark sky stargazing events to celebrate the Ningaloo Total Solar Eclipse and promote Western Australia's world-class night sky to eclipse chasers and visitors from around the world.

The Eclipse Discovery Tour dark sky stargazing events are planned to coincide with the weeks around the Ningaloo Total Solar Eclipse. Events begin on 25th March with the first stargazing night in Three Springs and the final event in Narrogin on 28th April. During the month-long celebration, events will cover four regions and visit towns such as Wickiepin, Perenjori, Mingenew, Murchison Settlement, Gascoyne Junction and Onslow.

The aim of the events is to disperse visitors across WA's regional areas and encourage eclipse chasers to stay longer on their holidays. The events will promote WA's dark night skies and the emerging space science industry. Visitors will also be able to view through telescopes to see special Southern Hemisphere star clusters, constellations and the Magellanic Clouds, not visible in the northern hemisphere.

Western Australia's clear and dark skies offer an experience second to none for recreational stargazers and nature lovers. Dark Sky Tourism is becoming a huge new driver for visitors to WA.

Carol Redford, CEO of Astrotourism WA said: "Places such as Jurien Bay's Turquoise Coast Visitor Centre, on the Astrotourism Towns map, is receiving an average of one enquiry a day from visitors asking where local stargazing places are."

"Western Australia is perfectly placed to become the stargazing capital of the world and grow a Dark Sky Tourism economy across the State. We have many comparative advantages that make us an ideal destination to access a pristine dark night sky where the billions of stars in the Milky Way Galaxy can be seen as they are meant to be."

"The ever-increasing artificial light that spills up into the night sky, means we see less stars. More than 80% of the world's population live under a light polluted sky and as a result, the Milky Way is hidden from more than one third of humanity. Just as people travel to see natural icons such as the Great Barrier Reef, the Amazon Rainforest or Antarctica, people will travel to Western Australia to see the Milky Way.
