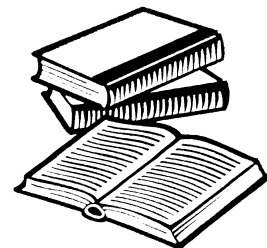

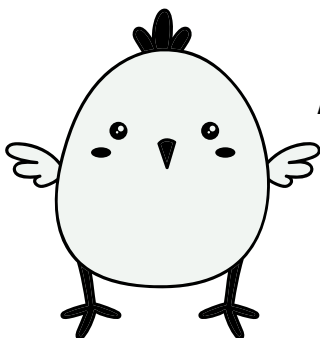

Quad bikes are not children's toys

As school holidays approach, a reminder that quad bikes and kids are a dangerous, and potentially deadly, mix. Since 2020, nine West Australians have been killed on quad bikes - two of them this year, including a girl aged under 10. Nationally, quad bikes are a leading cause of serious injury and death on Australian farming properties with 71 people killed, including 11 children, since 2017.

Royal Perth Hospital's Trauma Register shows the majority of quad bike accidents between 2013 and 2022 happened off-road or on farms. 60 per cent of 80 people admitted to Royal Perth Hospital with major trauma injuries from quad bike accidents, weren't wearing any safety devices.

Accidents are common with quad bikes tipping and easily rolling over on rough ground, at high speed or carrying heavy or uneven loads, often resulting in devastating outcomes.

Quad bike safety is improving with new rules introduced in late 2021, covering operator protection devices, and a tag that allows you to compare stability and safety of models.

But quad bikes are not children's toys. Perth Children's Hospital has seen 14 children, aged 15 years and younger, injured in quad bike accidents between January and August this year.

The safest option is for children not to ride quads, even as passengers, as children lack the size, and physical or cognitive ability to safely operate quad bikes built for adults.

The [Product Safety Australia website](#) has a range of great ways to increase safety on quad bikes for older riders and passengers, based around Prepare Safe, Wear Safe, Ride Safe.

Among the recommendations, Prepare Safe advises to make sure the quad is the right vehicle for the activity you want to do. Wear Safe is all about wearing a helmet and protective clothing, and Ride Safe includes advice on not carrying passengers on bikes designed for only one rider.

The figures speak for themselves. Keep kids off quad bikes these holidays, to keep them safe.

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Supporting a level playing field

Have you ever walked away from a business transaction and felt it was unfair or you questioned how you were treated?

Whether you are a consumer or owner of a small business, you may have felt that it didn't feel like a level playing field. These types of business behaviours are referred to as unfair trading practices and the Australian Government is looking into how these behaviours might be causing harm and what could be done about it.

Currently, the Australian Consumer Law (ACL) bans several specific unfair business practices, such as false representations or unfair contract terms, but there is no ban on unfair trading practices in general, which can also impact consumers.

Examples of unfair practices can include using confusing information when trying to unsubscribe from a streaming service, or even a red button for 'yes' and a green button for 'no'. Offering a "free prize" in exchange for collecting and using your personal data is another common example.

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) recognises that many consumers and small businesses have limited bargaining power in dealing and competing with large businesses, making them more susceptible to unfair trading practices, that can also discourage or inhibit small businesses from competing in markets.

The Australian Government is looking at international jurisdictions, seeking recommendations from all consumer agencies to help shape Australia's competition and consumer laws around unfair trading practices, and seeking input from the community to make sure that consumers and small businesses aren't disadvantaged by large business.

The experiences and knowledge of consumers, consumer groups and small businesses are being sought on the proposed reforms to help level the playing field to better protect consumers and small businesses, and to guide and promote better business conduct, generally.

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‘Bitumen bandits’ named in organised scam operation

- Travelling conmen target WA consumers as part of international based scam
- Thirty-one reports in nine months totalling payments of over \$264,000
- Commissioner for Consumer Protection says avoid these scam con artists who leave you with dodgy work

Consumer Protection is warning WA home and business owners to avoid dealing with at least eight road construction companies currently travelling around the state that offer to re-surface bitumen driveways and car parks for seemingly attractive prices, only to leave terrible bitumen work behind, in worse shape than before.

The travelling conmen known as ‘bitumen bandits’ use sub-standard materials, demand a higher fee than originally quoted and threaten to destroy the work completed if their invoices are not paid.

Commissioner for Consumer Protection Trish Blake describes the operation as an international organised scam with directors often based in the U.K. or Ireland.

“It is the definition of dodgy and a complete scam – it has to stop,” Ms Blake said.

“These con artists posing as tradespeople have a blatant disregard for the law and use completely unethical business practices that prey on innocent people, tricking them into a ‘good deal’ but ultimately charge highly-inflated prices for shoddy work.

“They lie to potential customers, saying they have left-over bitumen from a job nearby so can offer a cheap price but the finished job is left uneven, thin and soft.

“In one case in Derby, the bitumen washed away with rain the next day but the customer was still invoiced \$33,000 and demands were made for immediate payment.”

The bitumen bandits breach numerous consumer laws including coercing customers for payment after poor quality bitumen works are complete. They also approach potential customers uninvited with unsolicited consumer agreements, fail to observe the required

10 business day cooling off period, provide false representation as to the price of services and falsely claim to be affiliated with Main Roads and other reputable businesses.

Consumer Protection first issued a public warning in April 2023 and has now received 31 complaints since 1 January 2023 about travelling conmen who have targeted consumers and business owners in regional areas including Albany, Australind, Bunbury, Picton, Williams, Narrogin, Wongan Hills, Collie, Boddington, Kalgoorlie, Geraldton, Derby, Carnarvon, Karratha, Broome and several suburbs in the Perth metropolitan area.

The eight bitumen companies – conveniently registered in WA or over east – and the directors that Consumer Protection warns consumers and businesses to avoid, are: Bitumen Road Services Pty Ltd (Director Andrew Watson); Road Tech Oz Pty Ltd (Director Jack Reagan Maskell); Road Tech Construction Oz Pty Ltd (Director Anthony Kenneth Lee); Regional Civils Pty Ltd (Director Jay Brough); Top Coat Civils Pty Ltd (Director Gabriel Thomas O'Malley Mackerness); Rolo Bitumen Pty Ltd (Director Lee Desmond Rowland); Civil Highways Pty Ltd (Director Jonathan Michael Hovvels) and Ground Fix Landscapes Pty Ltd (Director James Lee). Regular workers from the above companies include Anthony Kenneth Lee, Simon Ross, Tom Ross, Thomas Dean Whaley and Matthew Nunn.

The cost of bitumen work subject to Consumer Protection complaints ranges from \$2,700 to \$46,000 with the majority of complaints stating dissatisfaction with the quality of work, being invoiced exorbitant prices compared to the original quote and demands for immediate payment including threats to destroy completed work for non-payment.

“These scam con artists will leave you with dodgy work, harass you for payment and quickly move on, making it difficult for customers and authorities to catch up with them,” Ms Blake says.

“If you have already had bitumen works done by any of these companies and are unsatisfied, we recommend not paying the invoice and report it to Consumer Protection.”

Consumer Protection is working closely with authorities across the country including WA Police, Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC), Home Affairs and other Australian Consumer Law regulators to identify action which may be taken against these conmen.

WA consumers are advised to resist approaches and high pressure sales tactics from the companies or individuals named and always seek multiple quotes from reputable local tradespeople

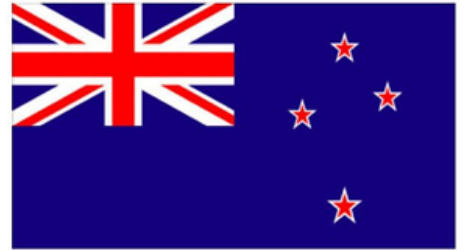

Stellar Stargazing

October is a great month to be out under the stars! Jupiter and the Moon appear together, there's a meteor shower plus Halloween to celebrate!

A great time to see Jupiter is after 9.30pm on the 2nd October. Jupiter will rise in the north east with the almost full moon rising below it just 10 minutes later. The pair will be bright and stunning!

This year the Orionids Meteor Shower will have almost perfect viewing conditions. Stargazers can expect to see up to 20 meteors per hour. The Orionids Meteor Shower is generated from Halley's Comet and peaks on the night of the 21st/22nd of October but can be viewed several days either side of the peak. The best views will be after 1am when the quarter Moon has set and the sky gets darker.



When to look: From midnight/1am to early morning, 21st/22nd October

Which direction to look: Toward the northern horizon.

Will you be trick or treating this Halloween? If you are, from sunset onwards keep an eye out for the gas giants! Jupiter will rise in the northeast, appearing as a bright star. Saturn will be overhead, as a slightly dimmer looking bright star. Happy stargazing!
